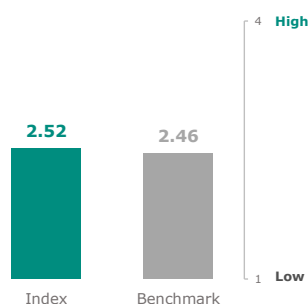
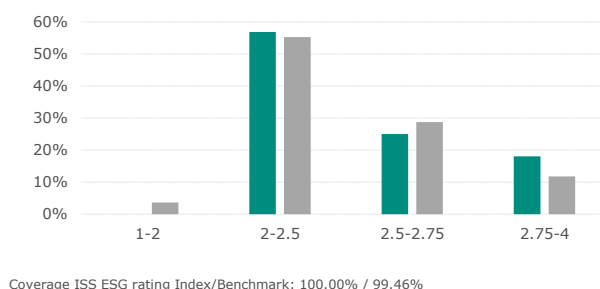

## Objective

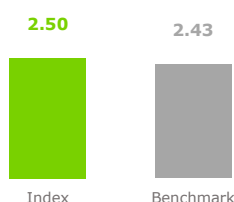
The Euronext® Eurozone Energy Transition Leaders 50 EW, is an equal weighted index that reflects the performance of the top 50 stocks, based on their performance in term of transition to a low-carbon economy, out of the 75 Largest stocks in term of free float market capitalisation, admitted to listing on the main markets of Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal and Spain. The weights of the constituents are reset to equal weight at the quarterly rebalances. The index serves as an underlying for structured products, funds and exchange traded funds. 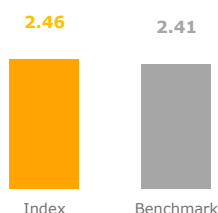

**ESG score distribution**


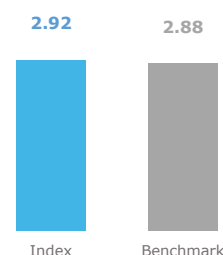

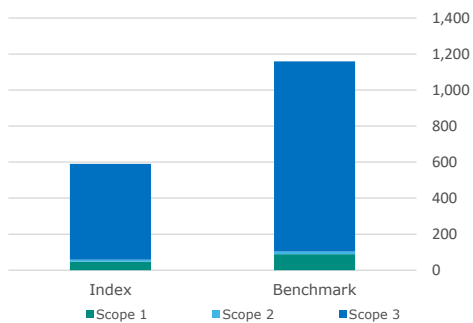

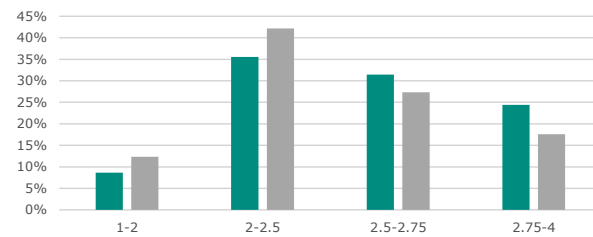

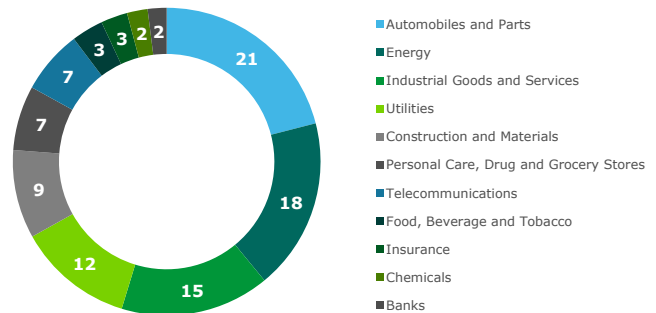
### Carbon footprint

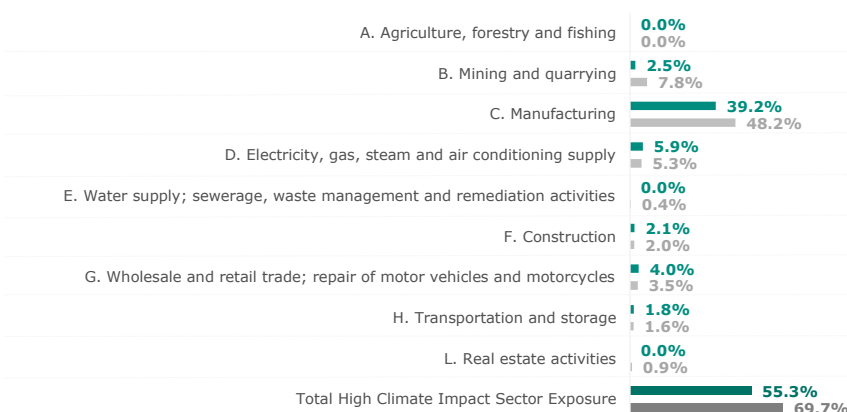

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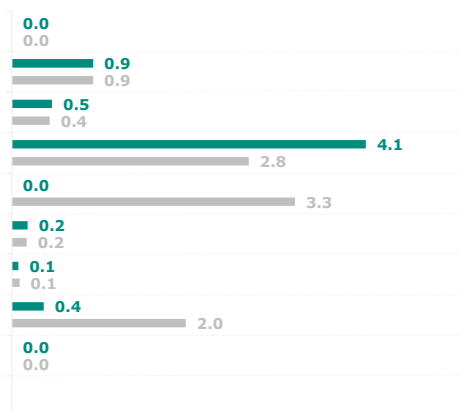
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## High Climate Impact Sectors Exposure (NACE)



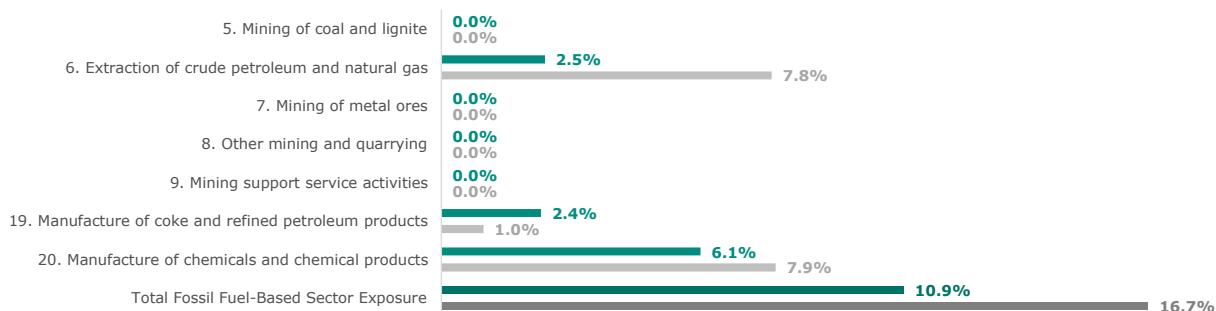

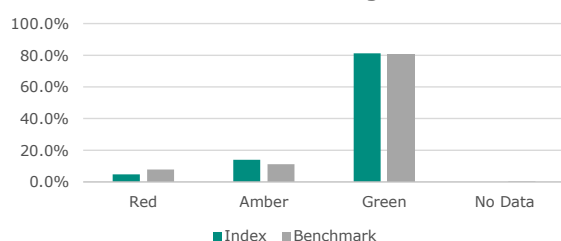

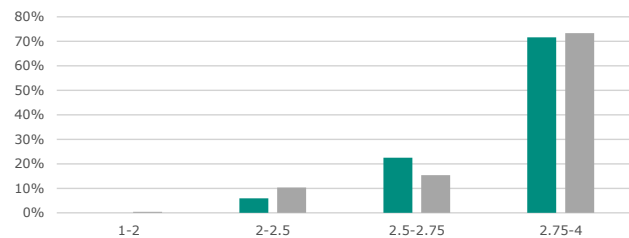

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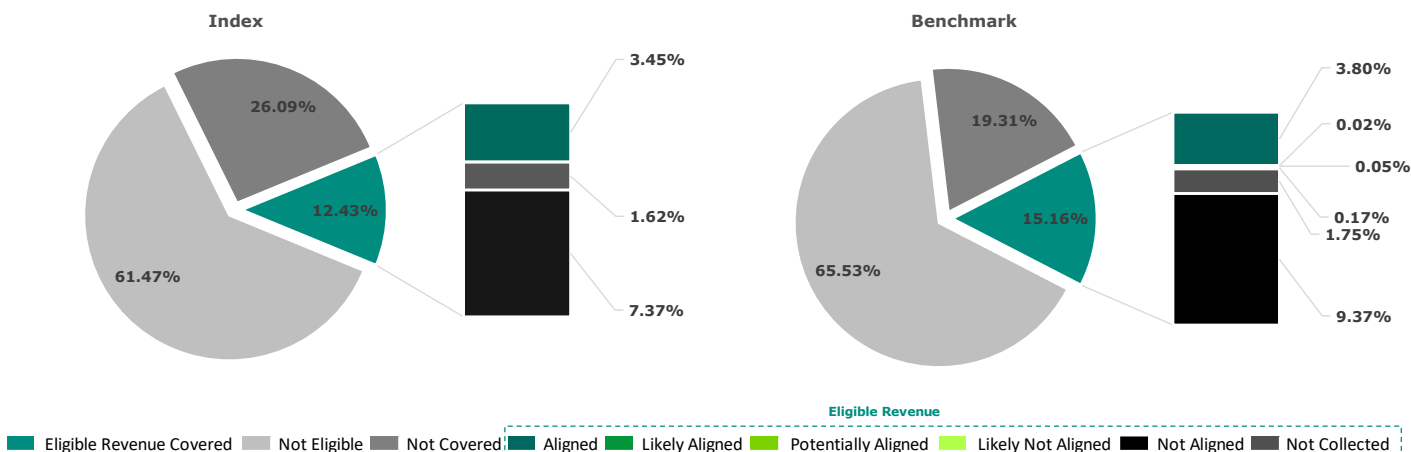
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## EU Taxonomy Alignment

The EU Taxonomy Alignment report evaluates a portfolio's levels of alignment against the six climate and environmental related objectives set out by the regulatory text, by determining investee companies' involvement in Taxonomy eligible economic activities, quantifying the respective revenues from these activities, and subsequently applying the three technical assessment steps of Substantial Contribution, Do No Significant Harm, and Minimum Social Safeguards. Currently, only the first two objectives are covered: Climate Change Mitigation and Climate Change Adaptation.

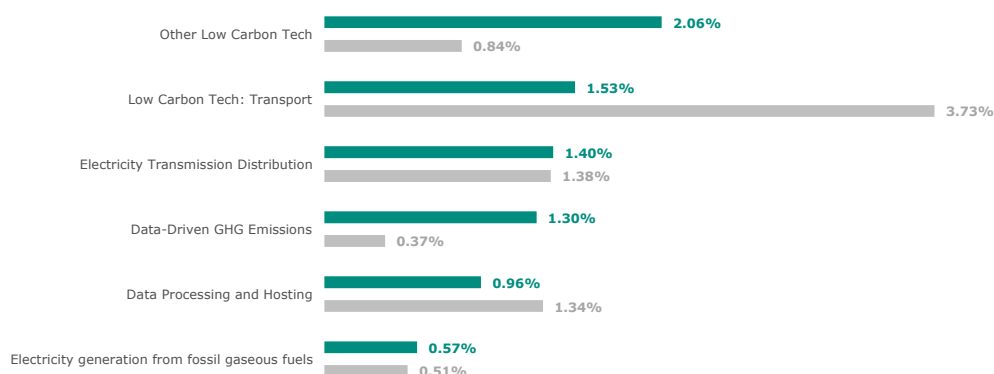

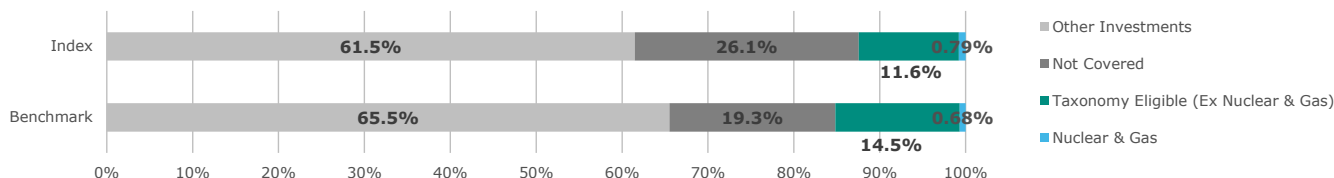
### Top Eligible Activities of the Index (%)
