3. INDEX REVIEWS

3.1 REVIEW FREQUENCY AND RELEVANT DATES

Review frequency: Quarterly

Review Effective Date: After the market close of the third Friday of March, June, September and December.

Review Cut-Off Date: After the market close of the penultimate Friday of February, May, August and November.

Review Announcement Date: At least two days before the Review Effective Date.

Review Weighting Announcement Date: Two days before the Review Effective Date, generally based on prices of the Tuesday before the Review Effective Date.

3.2 REVIEW SELECTION

Step 1: Index Universe

The Index Universe consists of the Companies included in the Euronext® Europe 500, North America 500 and Asia Pacific 500 indices with the Main listing in United States Of America, Canada, United Kingdom, Switzerland, Japan or Australia. At reviews this means included in the Index after the Review Effective Date.

Step 2: Eligibility screening at reviews

No eligibility screening is performed.

Step 3: Selection Ranking

No additional ranking is performed.

Step 4: Selection of constituents at the reviews

All eligible Companies are selected.

3.3 PERIODICAL WEIGHTING UPDATE

Weighting method

The Index is Free Float Market Capitalisation weighted.

The Weighting Factors are explained in the following paragraphs.

Number of shares

At each review, the number of shares included in the index will be updated with the number of shares listed on the Review Cut-Off Date, taking into account adjustments due to Corporate Actions.

Free Float factor

The Free Float Factor is determined based on the Review Cut-Off Date.

Capping Factor

The Capping Factor is not applicable for this Index Family.
