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1. GENERAL

This document is applicable to the Euronext PEA-PME 150 Index ("Index Family"), which consists of all the Indices as mentioned in the Reference Table.

The Euronext PEA-PME 150 Index is designed to reflect the price level trends in the trading of shares listed in France eligible to the PEA-PME Scheme.

Euronext Paris is the Administrator of this Index Family. For this Index Family no Independent Supervisor is appointed.

Composition of the index (including for the avoidance of doubt the non-inclusion therein) is without prejudice to the actual eligibility of the relevant individual company to the PEA PME scheme as provided for by applicable French laws. It is the investors' sole responsibility to ascertain whether any single company is eligible or not to the PEA PME scheme based on relevant legal and regulatory criteria.

Accordingly, the index and its composition may not be taken in any manner whatsoever as an official list of companies, and/or the endorsement by Euronext of the eligibility of any company, to the PEA PME scheme.

2. INDEX REVIEWS

2.1 REVIEW FREQUENCY AND RELEVANT DATES

Review frequency: Quarterly, with annual review in March.

Review Effective Date: After the market close of the last trading day of March (Annual Review), June, September and December.

Review Cut-Off Date: After the market close of the penultimate Friday of February, May, August and November.

Review Announcement Date: At least two days before the Review Effective Date.

Review Weighting Announcement Date: Two days before the Review Effective Date.

2.2 REVIEW SELECTION

Step 1: Index Universe

Index Universe definition

The Index Universe consists of companies incorporated in France, that have been admitted to listing on Euronext Paris' market or Euronext Growth Paris.

Companies that are classified under the Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) sector as per the ICB classification (351020) are not part of the Index Universe.

Step 2: Eligibility screening at reviews

Annual Review

Eligible companies are companies that are for the PEA-PME provisions. The following Companies are eligible:

Companies who's (full) market capitalisation is less than 2 Billion Euro's at the close of the last trading day of at least one of the last four calendar years preceding the Review-Cut off date.

The following Companies are not eligible for the index at Reviews:

- Companies admitted to listing after 30 June of the previous year are not eligible.
- Companies that are among the 20% lowest ranking companies based on median daily turnover as observed in the 12 months up to and including the Review Cut-Off Date are not eligible. If fewer than 150 companies qualify, the companies with highest median daily turnover will be added until there are 150 companies.

Quarterly Reviews

No additional eligibility screening is done at the quarterly reviews.

Step 3: Selection Ranking

Annual Review

The eligible Companies are ranked on free float market capitalisation.

Step 4: Selection of constituents at the reviews

Annual Review

The index is composed of the 150 highest ranking companies.

Quarterly Reviews:

No changes are made to the composition at the quarterly reviews.

2.3 PERIODICAL WEIGHTING UPDATE

Weighting method

The index is Free Float Market Capitalisation weighted.

The Weighting Factors are explained in the following paragraphs.

Number of shares

The Number Of Shares are determined based on the Review Weightings Announcement Date.

Free Float factor

The Free Float Factors are updated at the annual review.

Capping Factor

A maximum weighting of 2.5% is applied to each index constituent at each quarterly review. The assessment and new capping coefficients are based on the Review Weightings Announcement Date. Per ICB Supersector a maximum weighting of 20% is applied.

3.2 BASE CURRENCY

The Base Currency of this index family is Euro.

3.3 PUBLICATION

The opening level is calculated using the last known prices of traded constituents or in the case of constituents that have non-traded, halted or suspended status, the previous day reference prices or estimated prices (for IPOs, buyouts and swap offers).

The opening index level is disseminated at the same time as the first index level.

The index is calculated based on the most recent prices of transactions concluded on the constituents' relevant regulated markets. The level of the index is in principle published every 15 seconds. The index is calculated from 09:00 hours until Euronext Markets stop regular daytime trading on the days when the Euronext Markets are open for trading.

The closing level is the last level disseminated on the trading day.
